


The Ace of Cups is slightly discolored from exposure but the deck, unused. The Aces are stunning and courts and pips most beautifully designed. A fabulous treasure!</i></p> <p>Minimum Bid 290</p>			
<p>37 Spanish American 1883 USA 44+J Mint None Hochman 21b Andrew Dougherty</p> <p><i>Very rare AD deck used by Spanish immigrants, the border separations and numbers on the courts made it easy for them to play their familiar games. Missing HK; C3,7 & 9; all 4 Queens. The Spade Ace has a slightly different back design in the same color.</i></p> <p>Minimum Bid 75</p>			
<p>38 Sailors Cards 1986 Hong Kong 52+2J+XC Near Mint PB Tai Wah Ltd</p> <p><i>A cartoon type deck made for a company named Clamcleats that makes rope cleats for sailing boats and windsurfers. The characters depicted on each court are enjoying various water activities. Never used, it comes in its plastic box.</i></p> <p>Minimum Bid 10</p>			
<p>39 Triplicate #18 1886 USA 52+J Excellent Celluloid Hochman AD11 Andrew Dougherty</p> <p><i>One of the earliest Triplicate decks featuring miniature cards as indices in opposite corners. It has a wonderful engraved Spade Ace and early Best Bower Joker. The two color back features Thistles. It is in a celluloid box with a card spread on the top.</i></p> <p>Minimum Bid 225</p>			
<p>40 Coney Island Transformation c2001 England 52+J+TC+XC Mint OB1- Elaine Lewis</p> <p><i>Perhaps the best of Elaine Lewis' original design decks, the clever and colorful transformations are replete with frolicking playing card figures with most of the courts playing musical instruments. Title card shows this is #16 of 50 produced. A must!</i></p> <p>Minimum Bid 245</p>			
<p>41 Soo Line RR c1947 USA 52+J[x2] Near Mint OB1 Bollhagen SOO22 USPC?</p> <p><i>Here we have two neat decks for the Soo Line in near mint condition in a nice leather presentation case. One back has a large trout, out of the water and leaping for a fly - the other shows a woodland scene with a pond, moose & ducks. A good one!</i></p> <p>Minimum Bid 240</p>			
<p>42 University of Michigan 1926 USA 52+J+XC+BC Mint OB1 USPC</p> <p><i>This neat narrow ad deck with shiny gold edges is mint in blue slipcase with a great squirrel Joker. Opened, with a part wrapper with a 10¢ tax stamp & gold USPC seal, it is unused and still in factory order. The University crest is on the backs & box.</i></p> <p>Minimum Bid 30</p>
