<p>10 Edison Mazda Lamps AB6 c1920 USA</p> <p>52+J Excellent- OB1-</p> <p><i>Enchantment, one of ten beautiful Maxfield Parrish designs for General Electric Co. The original narrow slip case is blank with the card back on one side.</i></p> <p>USPC Minimum 100</p>			
<p>11 Queen High Equality P11 1971 USA</p> <p>52+J +ec Near Mint Plain OB</p> <p><i>An equality deck. - The Jacks are now Jackie, (a princess) and the Queen is High. (Poor King!). All the court cards are different. A unique, clever and not a common deck.</i></p> <p>Emjay Co. Minimum 15</p>			
<p>12 Caterson &amp; Brotz League L32 c1880 USA</p> <p>52+J Excellent- No Box</p> <p><i>Great Joker (see L10, L34) with "x" in corner. Clever pictures on pips (a few are hand-transformations); nice Swan back. As nicked, 3 cards darker face, 3 with light stains.</i></p> <p>Caterson &amp; Brotz, Philadelphia Minimum 300</p>			
<p>13 Hagenbeck Wallace Circus c1920 USA</p> <p>52+J+ec Mint OB1</p> <p><i>Early narrow advertising deck with great joker. Sparkling gold edges. The Carl Hagenbeck Wallace Circus was 2<sup>nd</sup> the largest in US behind Ringling Bros &amp; Barnum &amp; Bailey.</i></p> <p>USPC Minimum 85</p>			
<p>14 Navy US4a/US5 c1883 USA</p> <p>52+J Excellent+ RMOB1</p> <p><i>Rare crossover in Army, Navy decks with US3, US5 with Army joker. USPC did not want to show favoritism to Army or Navy. Worn gold edges, Russell Morgan 1880s slip case.</i></p> <p>USPC Minimum 225</p>
