Nearly 50 million people attended this celebration of the accomplishments of the 19th century and the anticipated developments of the 20th. It has great oval photo scenes.</i></p> <p>Minimum 95</p>			
<p>44 Jeanne l'Hachette #44 c1870 France 52 complete Near Mint OB2 Fourn. P.149 Grimaud</p> <p><i>Lovely copy of this well-known transformation deck, often referred to as Joan of Arc transformation. The cards are in near mint condition with two having minor soiling and a slight warp. Gold corners on all cards. Box shows only minor wear on edges.</i></p> <p>Minimum 500</p>			
<p>45 Russell's Rustlers 1910 USA 52+J+XC Very Good None Hoch. SE16 Willis S. Russell</p> <p><i>One of the six rare special issues of 'Rustlers' with baseball player backs. Used condition but generally very good. Two cards have small corner bends and H10 a faint notation. Neat substitute card used to replace one lost or damaged. Low minimum.</i></p> <p>Minimum 125</p>			
<p>46 Edison Mazda - Reveries c1925 USA 52+J+XC As Issued OB1 Hoch. AB6 USPC</p> <p><i>One of the 10 very collectable advertising decks for Edison Mazda, a General Electric company. These decks were designed by the famous illustrator Maxfield Parrish. It is in a cellophane wrapper inside the box with 52+J and, likely, a descriptive card.</i></p> <p>Minimum 125</p>			
<p>47 Triplicate #18 1876 USA 52+J Excellent+ None Hoch. AD12 Andrew Dougherty</p> <p><i>Nice example of the earlier Triplicate deck with the less intricate Spade Ace. Popular 'Thistle' back in reddish brown. Some browning on certain cards including Joker edge (see #14 Joker). Faint notation. on H6. A goodie.</i></p> <p>Minimum 150</p>			
<p>48 Jeu des Allies c1945 France 52+J Mint OB2- Minimum 35</p> <p><i>Patriotic cards issued in France around the end of WWII with a great caricature of Hitler adorning the "Fou" [Joker]. The Queen of Spades carries a shield with the words Liberte, Egalite, Fraternite - the French motto. Interesting War deck.</i></p>			
<p>49 Green Club 1925 USA 52+J+XC As Issued OB1 Hoch. NR6 S. F. Hanzel Card Co.</p> <p><i>This colorful non-revoke deck is still sealed in its cellophane wrapper [torn in front] and the cards have yet to see daylight! One of a series of four [Golden Diamond, Sweetheart & Blue Spade] produced by Hanzel to help prevent revokes in Bridge play.</i></p> <p>Minimum 130</p>
